Program Student Learning Outcomes (pSLOs)

To evaluate the program student learning outcomes (pSLOs), students were asked: “With respect to all of the classes you have taken at FLC toward an AS-T in Business Administration how well have the classes prepared you to...(each pSLO was listed).” Responses ranged from 5 “excellent preparation” to 1 “inadequate preparation”. Below is a summary of the student responses by the semester the student petitioned to graduate.

Please provide any additional comments about your experiences taking classes toward an AS-T degree in Business Administration that might help FLC improve the program.

Spring 2016

Most of my classes for my AST had to be taken at one of the other campus (ARC, SCC). The classes I did at FLC were generally preparation. I wish there were more classes offered at night for the working student.

Also, there was only ONE option in Spring only, which was a little inconvenient. Besides that, I feel the program is really great. I have learned a lot!

Majority of the professors were wonderful. My counselor xx was great and very helpful with the process.

The Math 343 class was the worst, students were not taught how to relate actual business problems in the class. Online Bus 300 with xx was ok, his class set the background for my major. Econ 302 and 302 with xx were the best.

All of the instructors were engaging and provided a comfortable learning environment.

Had to drop out of business calculus due to a lack of on campus assistance for the class (no tutors at all). The professor teaching it this first semester of it being offered had to constantly be corrected by students too frequently. Please try to make sure that there is assistance to help students through this difficult class with a difficult teacher.

Offer more business math courses. Counselors should be more informed about the transfer degree process.

Because of the way the transfer courses work out, as an AS I didn't learn much about management and marketing at FLC. I will be filling in those gaps at Sac State so I'm not worried.

Counselors need to be more involved for students. Have counselors schedule 1 or 2 mandatory appointments with students per semester to discuss their academic futures and plans. All graduation requirements are constantly changing to the point where even most of the counselors I've seen struggle to find what classes I should take. It feels like there are a lot of great students that get wasted and burnt out because they are tired of taking unnecessary classes. Especially business majors.

Getting into Business Math/Business Calculus was extremely difficult. Perhaps add more sessions. Considering accounting is a computerized career field, perhaps offer accounting courses in hybrid format (in class & online, simultaneously)

I loved how many online classes were offered in this program! The teachers did a great job of creating a classroom community even through online-only meetings and it made it much easier to fit courses into my schedule.

I think this will and has helped me have a mind set to be prepared in the business life and ready for life outside of school.

I would have to say Math 343 with Professor xx helped me prepare a lot for going into the second half of school at Sac State. He had a lot of insight and experience from when he worked in finance and it really helped me grasp the concepts learned in the Modern Business Math course. I learned a lot of valuable information in his class. Professor xx is another professor who I really enjoyed taking, his lectures and connections to his experience in practicing law really allowed me to understand the concepts learned in class.

Class availability and priority of registration, on several occasions I had to put off taking a class, sometimes for more than one semester because I didn't have a registration priority that allowed me to enter before they were completely full. Some classes had such few offerings that there weren't any classes I was able to attend. Some were prerequisites for future required classes which extended the time I needed to attend FLC for completion of my degree.

I had a counselor that gave me incorrect information regarding transferable courses and I also missed a registration date because a class I needed wasn't offered in the spring or summer during a time I was available.
